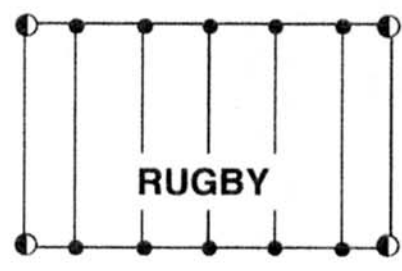
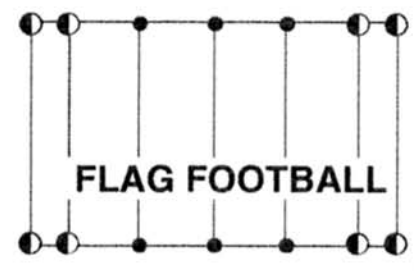
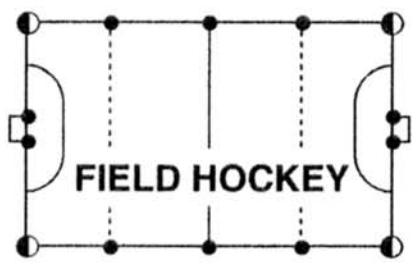
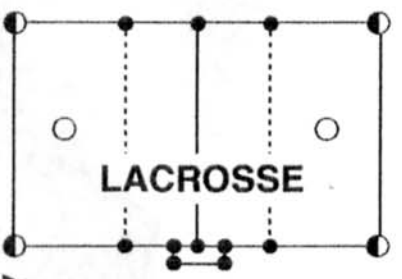
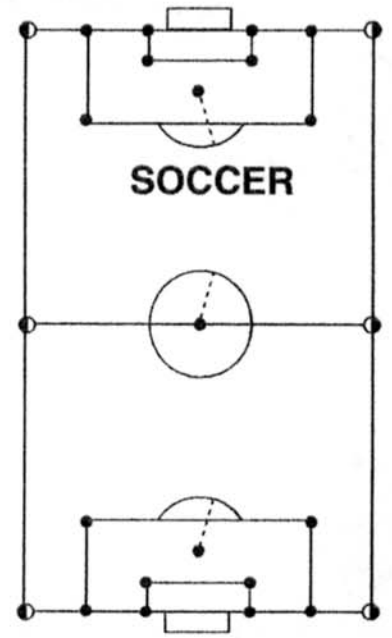
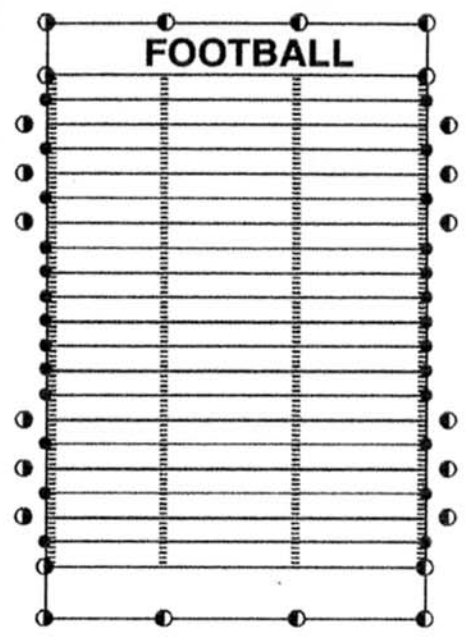
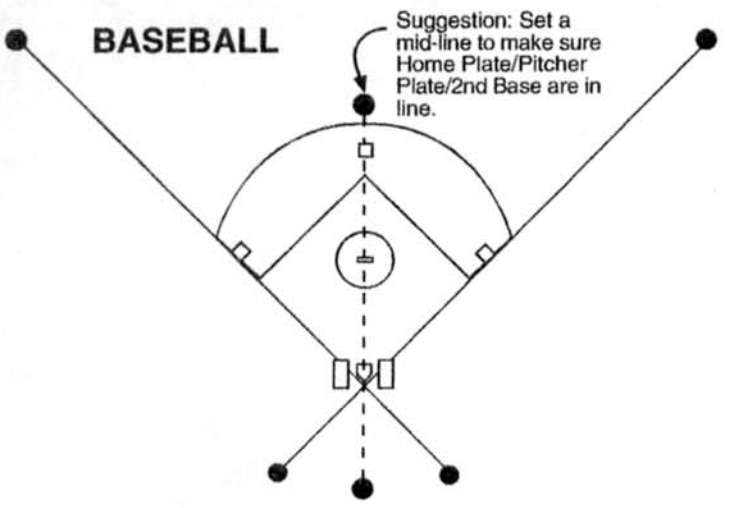


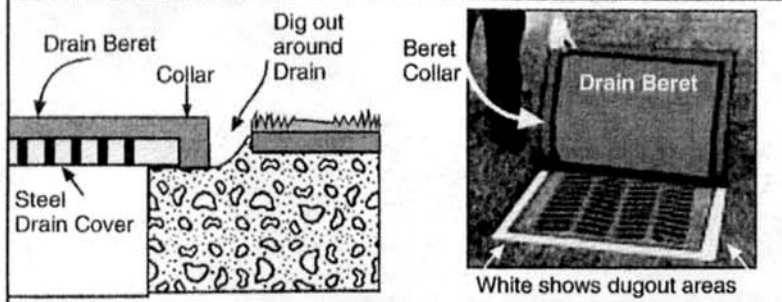
Ground Socket Diagrams

Tips

Do you have any exposed Drains on or around your practice fields? Add Drain Berets!



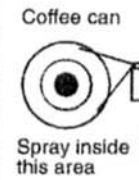
Our standard 30" Round Guard: #30-RG or 37" Square Guard: #37-SG fits most drains found at typical fields. Consult your distributor for any custom sizes.

Be sure to cap all sockets not in use! Our colored caps let you color code fields used for multiple sports.



Most importantly... you'll never have to measure again! The ground sockets let you line the fields again and again... in a fraction of the time!

Another helpful tip... to make your job easier next season:



Spray ground socket area with grass killer like Roundup or Triox. Use a coffee can with both ends removed to control spray. Your ground sockets will be easily located for future use. (sigh) ...another tough job made easier with Marksmart!

Aerators Tip: Before aerating your turf, install marker posts or flags into ground sockets to avoid damage.

Field Banners

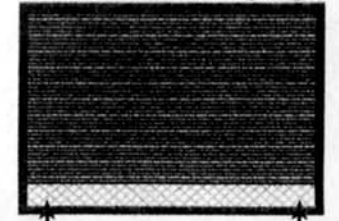
Quick Installation of Outfield & Soccer Field Banners

Use cable ties to attached vinyl banners to fencing or goal material.



Hemmed & Grommeted Windscreen Installation

Windscreen can be attached to existing chain link fence using either cable ties or hog rings.



Suggestion: Allow 6" opening at bottom for air flow.
